ACCOMMODATIONS/MEALS

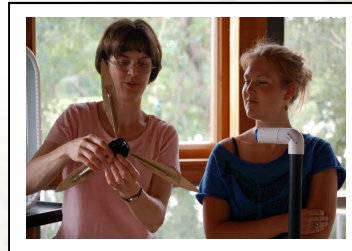
Cabins with two rooms each sleeping 4 people in lower bunks. Bring your own sheets and blankets or sleeping bag, pillow, and towel.
